nan any uning we ve ever experience on currier. For excess on the currenteries and now it has brought the human world to half on some levels, and ramped up human planning and ingensity on other levels, has been amazing to watch. And we're more than just watching it we're all participants in it. I hope that you and your family are able to stay houghtly and keep your footing during these days of uncertainty. During Lent and Holy Week, our focus is drawn to the cross and to the hope of the resurrection. That's especially true this year; the love of God is a truth that can sustain us.

One thing that can help is to realize that we're all in this together. Not just the people of our own community or country, but all the people in the world. In our day-to-day lives, we can

sometimes fonget that we've all brothers and sisters. Our Church, with its arms that stetch across every border to encircle us all, is a living example of that. When you reflect on the Sunday Cospel, others are hearing the same secret message, spoken in Croatian or Portuguese or Verlanzense. Their sorrows, Reas and joys are the same as ours, and like us, they pray and grow together as a faith family.
